BBC Africa Editor Fergal Keane delivered a message of hope in his keynote address at the Consular Corps/Association of Northern Ireland (CA-NI) Diplomatic Dinner held in the Crowne Plaza Hotel, Shaw's Bridge tonight.

The biennial dinner's charity sponsor for 2019 was Co-operation Ireland, and the veteran journalist spoke movingly about his time covering stories across the African continent and what he has learned about reconciliation that he hopes to see replicated in Ireland.
