

Consul General for the Republic of Poland, Dariusz Adler dies

Belfast, NORTHERN IRELAND: The Consular Corps/Association of Northern Ireland (CA-NI) extends our deepest condolences to the family and colleagues of the recently appointed Consul General for the Republic of Poland in Northern Ireland, Mr Dariusz Adler who passed away at his home today.

The 53 year-old Diplomat was appointed in November 2017 as the first Consul General at the newly established Consulate General for the Republic of Poland in Belfast.

Consul General Adler was an experienced Polish diplomat who has worked for the Polish Foreign Service for more than 20 years.

In 1996, he was hired at the Department of Security Policy at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

In 1999, he commenced his consular service and was appointed Deputy Consul General at the Consulate General of the Republic of Poland in Chicago, where he performed his duties for five years.

From 2006 to 2011, he worked at the Consular Section of the Embassy of the Republic of Poland in London. There, at first, he was the head of the Consular Assistance Section, and subsequently he became Head of the Consular Department.

From 2013 to 2017, he was the Polish Consul General in Edinburgh.

Funeral Mass for Dariusz Adler will be celebrated at St Brigid's Church, 40 Derryvolgie Avenue in Belfast, BT9 6FP on Friday March 23, 2018 at 5 p.m.
